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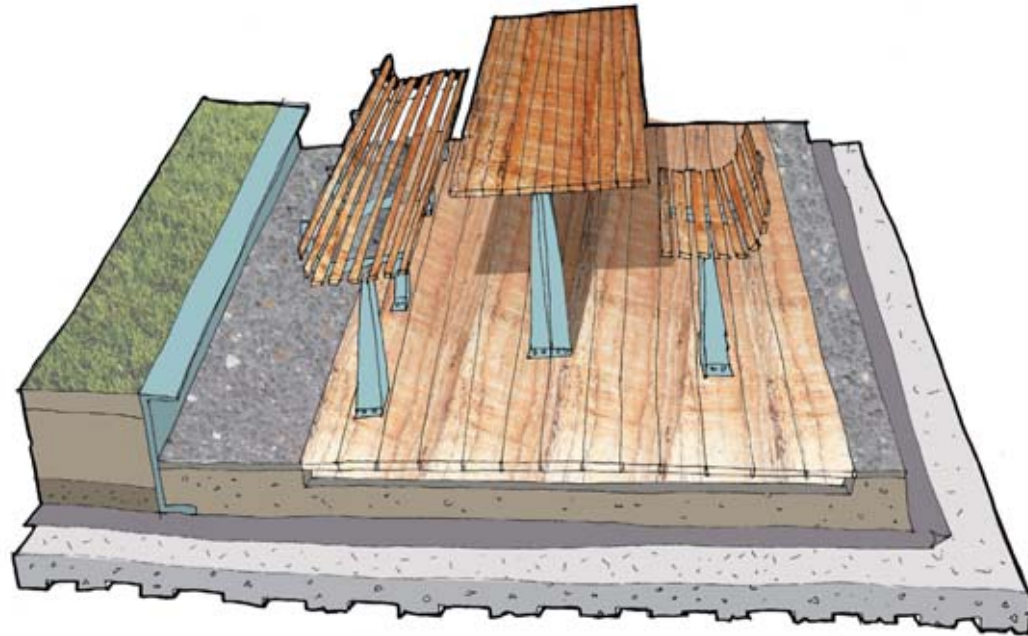

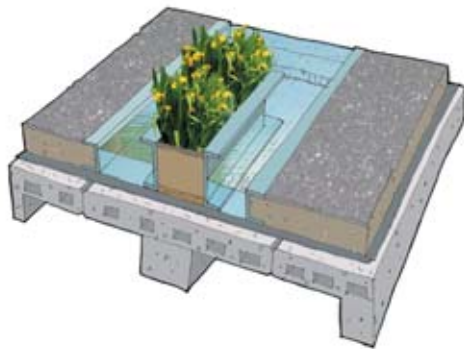

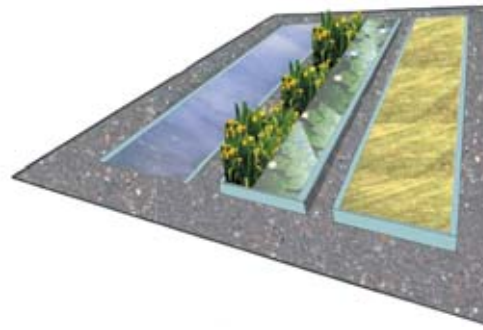
The roof garden is the business card of Cisco

The location in Amsterdam South-East is the largest branch of Cisco outside the United States. The entire campus-like area contains an underground parking garage (design HOK architects). HOSPER designed a roof garden for a large part of the parking deck. The outside space is the first contact visitors have with the company. The garden has a public-friendly feel to it and is also an important social meeting place for staff.

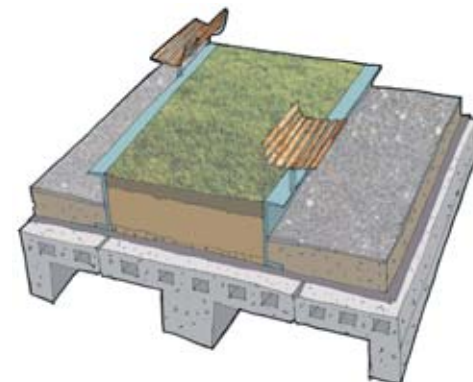
The outside space of around 12,000 m² in the first phase of the development is the size of an average Dutch park. The grass, plant, and pond elements ensure that the garden takes on various appearances. The parking spaces have a ridge due to the limited height of the deck. This contains lighting that lights up the many pathways in the garden at night. An important element in the garden is the furniture. It is a system of benches, many picnic areas, and grass, plant and pond borders that have been developed specifically for this project.
